Purpose: To persuade the reader to your point of view.

Focus: Current issues.

Language: Persuasive vocabulary, subjective voice, present tense.

<p><i>Your address</i></p> <p><i>Date</i></p> <p><i>The Editor Address</i></p> <p><i>Dear Sir/Madam</i></p>	
<p>Purpose</p> <p>Introduce yourself...I am a student..... State the purpose of the letter, Outline the issue/problem.</p>	
<p>Thesis</p> <p>Give your opinion about the issue.</p>	
<p>Argument 1</p> <p>Make your first main point. Give evidence/data/examples to support your point of view.</p>	
<p>Argument 2</p> <p>Make your first main point. Give evidence/data/examples to support your point of view.</p>	
<p>Argument 3</p> <p>Make your first main point. Give evidence/data/examples to support your point of view.</p>	
<p>Restatement of thesis</p> <p>The conclusion pulls your arguments together. It may include recommendations or suggested solutions or a 'Call to Action'. Round off/Conclude.</p>
