Description

Economics and Business is a subject designed for students who have an interest in the Business Discipline. The subject has been created to allow students to:

- Experience senior General Business in preparation for Years 11 and 12
- Obtain a **basic industry qualification** and gain an introduction to VET subjects on offer in Years 11 and 12

Units of Study:

All students will undertake **BSB10120 Certificate I in Workplace Skills** in Semester Two delivered and assessed by **Aquinas College RTO Number 30216** via face-to-face instruction. Once completed to a successful standard, students will be awarded 2 points towards their QCE (Queensland Certificate of Education).

BSB10120 – Certificate I in Workplace Skills Course Details and Pathways:

- There are no prerequisites for students to enroll into the course.
- Student will complete all assessment online through Cloud Assess, which will incur a fee of **\$50 per student charged to school fees**.
- Students are not required to complete industry placement as part of this qualification.
- Students can use this qualification as a pathway for further vocational training such as BSB30120 Certificate III in Business or BSB50120 Diploma of Business.
- Additional assistance with language, literacy and numeracy is available and provided in consultation with Learning Enhancement.

Assessment Plan:

The Assessment in Economics and Business will provide opportunities for students to show their abilities across the key strands in this subject. Economics and Business aims to be relevant in the 21st century and as such the assessment consolidates student learning and student independence. Units of competency are clustered and assessed in a way that replicates a simulated office environment.
